I. Introductions and Welcome

Introductions and review of our mission statement: Create a Construction Career Pathways system that is responsive to the needs of employers and employees in the region. Next meeting: June 4th, 2020; 730am – 9am, 11641 Mosteller Road

II. MACC Tech Mining, Asphalt, Concrete & Construction (MACC) Technology -

The industry credential aims to help fulfill the employment needs of the members of OAIMA and other organizations associated with construction. Butler Tech is the first school to integrate the program into their 2020-2021 program. III. ACI Update – Building pipeline for the community. Lydia Burns and Anthony Riciardi presented. Worked with 630 students in grades 7 & 8 who were in math and algebra, take basics in construction and trades (carpentry, electric, pipe fitting, drywall) and applied critical math skills that are needed in the trades. This project based learning was very successful. It helped to identify students strong in math and interested in the construction trades. 47 students selected. Summer Camp is June 8-25 for 20 campers and application process is now open. Rosie's Girls is July 6-24 for 24 Campers at Holmes High School. The Spirit of Construction and Impact 100 help to fund all these activities. Construction Career Days is September 16 & 17 at Butler County Fair Grounds. In 2019 over 2,600 students, 55 schools and 60 exhibitors participated. In 2020 the target is 3,000 students, 75 schools and 100 exhibitors. Employers are asked to participate and are key to the success of this event. It is free to exhibit and for students to come. IV. iSpace - Sue Williams presented. An educational resource for schools. Working with schools from kindergarten on up! Started in 2001 due to the concern about math and science skills. Offer professional workshops for teachers as well. Real world applications showing the most up to date technology to students and teachers. Parents benefit as well. Yearly iSpace Day is free to all. First Saturday in October at Princeton High School. They also focus on women, Girls in STEM advisory board. Girls, grades 5th to 8th, get an immersive experience to understand what engineers do in an all-female environment. All events are listed on their website. VI. Contractor for the Day – Jason Harvey with Ohio Contractor's Association presented. Events targeted toward all students. A high school (100-150 students participating in April/May) in the spring and university level in the fall. They take the students out and show them what it is like on the worksites. Ohiocontractors.org. It is heavy highway and road organizations participating. The association also offers scholarships to the students based on recommendations from the instructors. Can be anywhere from \$3,000 to \$9,000 depending on funding. Tri-State schools are all welcome to participate! <u>ohiocontractors.org</u>

<u>Construction Career Connection</u> – Friday, April 24, 9 to 1 at the Boone County Fairgrounds. This is a free field trip for grades 7 to 12. Lunch provided. Students will have the chance to operate heavy construction equipment and participate in hands-on activities in our exhibit hall. We are still accepting employer participation. There's no charge to participate but members of the BIA are given priority in the exhibit space.

<u>The Big Dig</u> – Saturday, April 25 from 9 to 5 at the Boone County Fairgrounds. Price is \$10 per person (children 3 and under are free). VIII. Tech Cred and Ohio State Updates - John Sherwood, Ohio Office of Workforce Transformation. Workforce is high priority for Ohio. They spend over a billion a year on the workforce needs. The influence of technology and the changing scope of jobs and skills needed are influencing the state priority focusing on workforce. There are 330,000

more jobs in Ohio today than in 2008 but there are 190.000 fewer people in the workforce. It is estimated that by 2028 the mismatch between jobs and talent will be 650,000 open positions.

*TechCred – Designed to help employees and employers upgrade skills. There is \$12 million a year to reimburse when earning technology-focused credentials. They are on the third funding round and it closes at the end of March. Providers are chosen by employers. The employer apply by listing the employees that are receiving the training and the cost. The state reviews and will select who is reimbursed. Cap per employers is \$30k per funding round. Jurgensen received \$20k the first round and \$17k the second funding round. There were 444 unique Ohio employers awarded for a total of \$4.2 Million was allocated! 3,187 credentials will be funded allowing over 3,000 Ohioans will be upskilled through round 2. (Note: Kentucky has a version of this as well.) The funding is friendly to small businesses. Credentials reimbursed are Certificates and Certifications. Must be industry recognized, technology focused and short-term training. Employees must enroll and complete training in 18 months, after credit is earned, employer has 6 weeks to submit documentation to receive reimbursement. Can recommend credentials to be added with appropriate documentation that it meets all requirements. <u>TechCred.Ohio.Gov</u> to apply by March 31st! Power point is attached.

IX. CAA Update – Erik Thomas updated group on the Co-Op Program. Nine students are enrolled and are retained mid-way through the program. The class ends on April 2nd and employers will have the opportunity to meet the graduates. If interested reach out to Erik. There are 4 quarters a year, the remaining are: May, late July and early October. The goal is 40 graduates for the year. This is a pre-apprenticeship program.
